SEPTEMBER

Sunday September 1 | Labor Day Float | 9am @ Stilling Basin

Float down the Tulpehocken Creek starting from the Stilling Basin at Blue Marsh Lake to the carry-out at Gring's Mill. Participants must provide their own vessels (paddleboards or kayaks) and transportation back to the starting point from the finish. Parks staff will be on hand to talk about historic and natural points of interest as we float. All participants must wear proper life jackets.

Demonstrations of the Otto "Hit and Miss" Engine will take place at 12:30 and 3:00 pm. The C. Howard Heister Canal Museum will be open to the Public
